



VISITING ARRANGEMENTS

WE'RE OPEN FOR NO CONTACT POD VISITS

We hope you have already received our update on visiting arrangements but to confirm, we're happy to say we're back open for visiting. We know how important this is to you and your relative so we ask you to work with us to make this work as safely as possible.

All visits will be in the pods and we will not be doing LFD tests.

Please:

- Book an appointment—We are only having one pod visit arranged in each house at any one time *Unfortunately, we are unable to accept visitors without an appointment.*
- Have no physical contact with your relative and restrict numbers to 2 people only.
- Restrict your visit to 30 minutes and once a week only so we can share the visiting time fairly.
- When you arrive, ring the bell and wait for a member of staff to greet you. They will carry out your temperature check, support you with the necessary PPE and paperwork needed. They will then direct you to the pod to meet your relative
- Only bring gifts which can be sanitized eg boxes of chocolates. Please do not bring flowers.

End of Life visiting—in these circumstances please discuss visiting arrangements with us as we will prioritise and understand how important it is for you and your family to spend time with your loved one.

As Landermeads approaches its 32nd year and all celebrations are on hold for the time being, we wanted to bring you some exciting news! We are delighted to let you know that we will soon be opening a sister home to Landermeads and Catherine Tam called Goodman House!

In the midst of the pandemic last year, Landermeads purchased the site of the former West End Surgery on the High Road in Beeston. We are currently developing the site into a small service to provide 24hr nursing care for younger adults, very similar to Catherine Tam House. To say we are excited would be an understatement!

Our aim has always been to ensure that Landermeads retains its ethos of an emotionally led, person centred home in which the family we support come first. To ensure this is retained through any new venture, we believe passionately that anything we develop has to be close to Landermeads. The fact that Goodman House is half a mile away from Landermeads retains our beliefs. With Beeston being within a five minute walk from the front door and the fact Goodman House is on the tram line to Nottingham, it brings endless opportunities for the family members that will call it their home.

Just a little history – all of house names at Landermeads have significance reflecting the history of the family and building and Goodman House is no different. It is named after Ros' parents, Derek and Margaret Goodman, who were joint founder members of Landermeads in 1986. Derek passed away in June 2018 and Margaret continues to support everything we do..

We are aiming to be open by late April this year, if everything goes to plan! We will keep you updated over the coming months with exciting developments as Goodman House begins to take shape!
